

The local Athens donor site is located at 213 E. Washington Avenue, Suite 104, and their local number is 423-453-5846. MEDIC is the primary blood product provider for 24 hospitals in 22 counties including Starr Regional Medical Center of Athens and Etowah. As a reminder, the blood, platelets, and plasma products on the shelves now is what would be used in a trauma event, and it takes at least three days for donated blood to be processed and ready for distribution.
