Area and State News

◆ State Rep. Mark Cochran, R-Englewood, and State Sen. Mike Bell, R-Riceville, have secured \$50,000 in state funding for maintenance and improvements for the Tri-County Center in McMinn County. Tri-County Center is a non-profit organization that seeks to help developmentally challenged adults find occupations while offering choices to meet the needs of those with disabilities. The appropriated funds are part of a \$52.8 billion balanced budget passed in April by the 112th General Assembly.

• Governor Bill Lee announced the appointment of Dr. Morgan McDonald, MD, as interim commissioner for the Tennessee Department of Health (TDH), effective Friday, June 3. McDonald is the Deputy Commissioner for Population Health at the TDH and formerly served as an Assistant Commissioner and the Deputy Medical Director for Family, Health and Wellness. McDonald earned her undergraduate and medical degrees from Vanderbilt University and completed her residency in internal medicine and pediatrics at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. McDonald will serve until a permanent commissioner is named.
