

FRIDAY'S MARKET REPORT Last week's inflationdriven weakness extended into Monday, with markets finishing firmly to the downside. The S&P 500 closed in bear-market territory. Treasury yields were higher. Bitcoin plunged to its lowest levels since 2020 on news that a crypto-lending company is halting withdrawals.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 876.05 to 30,516.74. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 151.23 to 3749.63, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 530.80 to 10,809.22.

Power Reduction Request

Wayne Scarbrough of Athens Utilities Board (AUB) issued the following press release: TVA and AUB are asking customers for voluntary reductions in power use until further notice. The extreme heat across the entire Valley has caused a tight power supply situation across the Tennessee Valley. TVA currently has one fossil fuels generation unit that will be offline until later in the week and they have a nuclear unit that is down for maintenance. The voluntary reduction is needed to help ensure a continued supply of power to essential services throughout the Tennessee Valley region and avoid interruptions in service. TVA is operating all available generating plants at full capacity, and crews from TVA and local distributors of TVA power are working around the clock to make power available to customers. AUB officials ask all electric power customers, residential, commercial and industrial to cooperate in reducing power usage during this critical situation. Customers should turn off lights, appliances, and electrical equipment when not in use and until absolutely needed. Reduce the use of cooling by adjusting thermostats to at least 78 degrees, higher if possible. Postpone all uses of hot water and avoid using electric dryers. Limit all cooking.
