✓ UT Extension McMinn County will be having a Freezer Meal class on Friday, July 15th. Freezer meal planning involves planning meals that can be frozen ahead of time. Meals are prepared, labeled, and frozen. The result is having meals prepared in the freezer when they are needed. Classes will be held at the McMinn Higher Education Center, UT Extension Office McMinn County, 2345 Denso Drive, Athens. Come by to register today, limited to 30 people. When you register choose your class time: 10-11am, 11am-Noon or Noon-1pm. Cost is \$20. Each participant needs to bring their own meat/protein and freezer bags/containers. TENNESSEE GAS PRICES FALL: Gas prices across Tennessee are trending lower this week after a run of record-setting prices at the pump. The Tennessee Gas Price average is now \$4.59 which is 30 cents more expensive than one month ago and \$1.74 more than one year ago. "After weeks of increasing gas prices, Tennesseans are finally catching a small break at the pump. Tennessee also moved up one spot this week to the 7th least expensive market in the nation," said Megan Cooper, spokeswoman for AAA - The Auto Club Group. "Oil and gasoline futures saw significant losses last week, likely tied to last week's rate hike from the Federal Reserve bank, sparking fears of a possible recession. Falling crude oil prices and a drop in domestic demand are helping to limit pump price increases, however, the fuel market remains very unstable. Fluctuating pump prices still can't be ruled out this summer."

- **1788 -** The U.S. Constitution went into effect as New Hampshire became the ninth state to ratify it.
- **1853** The envelope folding machine was patented by Dr. Russell L. Hawes of Worcester, MA.
- **1940 -** Richard M. Nixon married Thelma Catherine 'Pat' Ryan this day.
