MORE TENNESSEE LAWS EFFECTIVE JULY 1st

- ◆ HB 2657: The "Transparency in Sentencing for Victims Act" requires courts to place on record the estimated number of years and months a defendant will serve in prison before becoming eligible for release.
- ♦ HB 2783: Through July 1, 2025, if you retire from a school, you can come back as a teacher, substitute, bus driver, etc. without the loss or suspension of retirement benefits so long as certain conditions are met.
- ◆ HB 7004: Requires school districts to have after-school mini camps, bridge camps and summer school to deal with learning loss.

TDOT Announces New Hotline

The Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) is launching a new hotline for drivers to report potholes and other maintenance issues that may be considered roadway safety hazards. The new hotline number is 833-TDOTFIX (836-8349). The virtual call center operates Monday – Friday from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. If someone calls on holidays, weekends, or after hours they can leave a message or call back during business hours. TDOT must collect as much relevant information as possible about a maintenance work request. The call center agent will ask the driver a series of questions and submit that information through TDOT's online maintenance work request form. Drivers should remember Tennessee's Hands-Free Law when calling the hotline. Citizens can still alert TDOT to potholes and other maintenance issues using this online form:

- **1844 -** Mormon leader Joseph Smith & his brother were killed by a mob in Carthage, Illinois.
- 1847 New York & Boston were linked by telegraph.
- **1880** Helen Keller was born in Tuscumbia, Alabama. When she was 19 months old, she suffered an illness that left her blind, deaf, & mute. Anne Sullivan taught her to speak, read braille, and lip-read by placing her fingers on the lips and throat of the speaker. Keller later wrote several books and gave lectures around the world.
- **1927 -** TV icon Bob Keeshan was born. He was best known as Captain Kangaroo. He died in 2004.
- **1950-** The U.N. Security Council passed a resolution calling on member nations to help South Korea repel an invasion from the Communist North.
