# Starr Regional To Expand

Starr Regional Medical Center (SMRC) has announced a \$5.4 million expansion of the hospital for a cardiac catheterization (cath) lab. Construction actually began Wednesday, June 29th. The cardiac cath lab and launching of an interventional cardiology program at SRMC means greater access to life-saving heart care in McMinn County. It is estimated to be completed in early 2023. SRMC has been working to improve the cardiac services offered within the community. The providers and technology within the cardiac cath lab will be able to diagnose and provide treatment for heart blockages and other cardiac conditions without a commute. Starr Regional Medical Center will be the only facility within 30 miles of their campuses to offer these services, allowing more patients the ability to receive this type of important life saving care closer to home.

Starr Regional is an accredited Chest Pain Center and is affiliated with Covenant Health and their cardiac providers. The accreditation, affiliation and new cardiac cath lab will be a tremendous step forward in the fight against heart disease.

The 2,500 square foot addition will be located where the Outpatient Services entrance and parking area is currently. This location is close to the emergency department, ensuring convenient access to rapid evaluation for patients experiencing a cardiac event.

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REDORT: Major indexes were mixed. The price of oil fell by more than 2%, sitting around \$109/barrel. The U.S. 10-year Treasury yield retreated to around 3.1%. European and Asian shares were lower. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was 82.32 to 31,029.31. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 2.72 to 3,818.33, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 3.65 to 11,177.89.

- The Athens Parks and Recreation Department has announced that anyone interested in having a brick placed in the Veterans Park walkway. in honor or in memory of a veteran, must place their order by 4:30 pm on July 22nd to be included in the October 8th ceremony. In addition to a brick being placed in the walkway, brick purchasers receive an attractive certificate suitable for framing, in honor of their veteran. Veterans Park walkway bricks are \$50 each and the city also has replica bricks available for \$20 each. Replicas are 1 1/4" x 3" and are designed to take home as a souvenir as part of the ceremony. Bricks are available for purchase online at athenstn.com/parks if paying with a debit/credit card, or at the Recreation Department, located in the Athens Municipal Building. "2022 is the 20th anniversary of the dedication of the Veterans Park brick walk. We will be celebrating on October 8 with a return visit from the Crew of the USS Charles R. Ware, who were in attendance 20 years ago," said Austin Fesmire, Director of Parks and Recreation. "Over the past two decades over 4,000 veterans have been honored at the park and I encourage everyone looking for a special way to honor or memorialize a veteran, to purchase a brick, as it is truly a special gift."
