

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: Equities ended lower after a key inflation report came in higher than expected. Growth style stocks outperformed the wider market. Bond yields were little changed. Oil is now \$95/barrel. European shares were sharply lower on the U.S. inflation data amid a myriad of issues facing the European economy as the Russian-Ukrainian conflict drags out. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 208.54 to 30,772.79. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 17.02 to 3,801.78, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 17.15 to 11,247.58.

National News

- ✓ For the first time since May, COVID-19-related hospital admissions are forecasted to increase again in the U.S. Omicron subvariants continue to spread, according to updated forecasting models used by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas, are expected to see the greatest increases in hospitalizations.
- ✓ An American tourist fell into Mount Vesuvius, an active volcano in Italy, after taking a selfie. The 23-year-old man fell several meters into the ash of the crater before being saved by nearby park officials on Saturday. He was trying to retrieve his phone after dropping it. The man sustained only minor injuries according to officials.
- ✓ After a fourth shark attack off Long Island in the past two weeks injured a surfer, a beach was temporarily closed to swimmers Wednesday. A surfer was bitten by a shark around 7:45 a.m. on Wednesday near Smith Point Beach, according to Suffolk County officials. Officials believe the attack was by a tiger shark. Last Thursday, a teenage girl survived a shark attack at a Keaton Beach in northwestern Florida's Taylor County on Thursday. The teen was scalloping in water approximately 5 feet deep near Grassy Island when she was bitten by the shark. Swimmers are advised to stay out of the water when lifeguards are not on duty, to avoid dusk and dawn, not wear shiny jewelry and not go into the water if bleeding.
