Early Voting in McMinn County

✓ From the McMinn County Elections Commission Office: McMinn County voters can vote early for the Aug. 4 State and Federal Primary & State and County General Election now through Saturday, July 30.

TeAnna McKinney, Administrator of Elections advises that voters need to be aware that the August ballot is longer than normal and will take additional time to complete. Voters can choose which candidates will advance to the general election in November, to retain or replace judges and elect the county official office holders in your county. City residents of Englewood & Etowah will also elect city office holders. Early voting runs Monday to Saturday at the Courthouse. Monday- Friday hours are 9:00 am-5:00 pm and Saturday 9:00 am- 12 noon. Monday July 25th at 12 noon until 5:00 pm and Tuesday, July 26th -Friday July 29th 9:00 am -5:00 pm you may also vote at Athens Regional Park Conference Center. McMinn County residents can find early voting hours, polling locations and view sample ballots on mcmminnelections.com or the Secretary of State's website GoVoteTN.gov and GoVoteTN app. The GoVoteTN app is free in the App Store or Google Play. McMinn County voters need to bring valid photo identification to the polls. A driver's license or photo ID issued by the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security, Tennessee state government or the federal government is acceptable even if it's expired. A student ID or out-of-state driver's license is not acceptable. For more information about what types of IDs are permitted, visit GoVoteTN.gov.
