• Firefighters deployed air tankers, bulldozers and hand crews to battle a fast-moving wildfire just west of Yosemite National Park on Sunday. The fire suddenly and unpredictably grew into one of the largest fires of the year, forcing thousands of evacuations. By Sunday, the fire had consumed 15,603 acres, and was zero percent contained, according to the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection.
