WACKER Expansion

Tennessee Governor Bill Lee, Department of Economic and Community Development Commissioner Stuart McWhorter, and WACKER officials announced today the company's intention to expand its presence in Southeast Tennessee with the addition of new silicone production facilities in Charleston. The expansion would involve a phased investment of more than \$200 million over several years and create more than 200 new jobs in Bradley County. This is the second major expansion the global chemical R&D and manufacturing company will make in our area.
