

## Sounds of Summer Concert Series

The fourth concert in the 2022 Sounds of Summer series will bring back the jazzy sounds of The Tim Hughes Quartet and Will Boyd and Kelle Jolly to The Friendly City on Saturday, August 6<sup>th</sup>. The Tim Hughes Quartet was founded in 2008 by Athens' resident Tim Hughes. The group began by playing standards by notable jazz musicians such as Louis Armstrong, Duke Ellington and Dizzy Gillespie. Eventually the group started writing and performing their own music as well. The group consists of Tim Hughes on trumpet and flugelhorn, Robin Payne on keyboard, her husband David Payne on drums and Robert Grier on bass.

Husband and wife duo Boyd and Jolly are well known for their respective jazz performances and songwriting. Kelle is an accomplished professional vocalist, songwriter and music educator. While her style is somewhat evocative of Sarah Vaughan, Ms. Jolly's infectious stage presence and unique style demonstrates musical creativity from rhythmic scat singing to whistle tones.

Festival producer Meredith Willson states " We are so excited to bring back these SoS favorites to the Market Pavilion stage. They are crowd pleasers and perennial favorites of this concert series and we look forward to another great evening of free live music in downtown Athens."

The concert will begin at 7:00 p.m. under the Market Park Pavilion. Kona Ice will be serving their signature frozen desserts/drinks and attendees are encouraged to bring their own lawn chairs.



• A ship carrying grain left the Ukrainian port of Odessa for Lebanon on Monday under a safe passage agreement, according to Ukrainian and Turkish officials. This is the first departure since the Russian invasion blocked shipping through the Black Sea five months ago. Ukraine's foreign minister called it "a day of relief for the world".

• The White House said on Monday U.S. House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi has the right to visit Taiwan, adding that China appeared prepared to respond in coming days, possibly with military provocations. Pelosi was set to visit Taiwan on Tuesday, as China warned that its military would never "sit idly by" if she visited the selfruled island claimed by Beijing. White House national security spokesman John Kirby told reporters that nothing about Pelosi's possible trip changed U.S. policy toward Taiwan.

**MONDAY'S MARKET REDORT** Equities finished lower. The consumer staples and utility sectors were among the best performers. Energy and financials lagged. Oil prices were lower at below the \$100 per barrel mark. The 10-year Treasury yield fell below 2.6%. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 46.73 to 32,978.41. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 11.66 to 4,118.63, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 21.71 to 12,368.98.
