

**TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT.** Global equity markets finished lower. Oil prices were little changed. WTI was at \$94. The 10-year Treasury yield jumped to 2.74%. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 402.23 to 32.396.17. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 27.44 to 4,091.19, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 20.22 to 12,348.76.

#### TODAY IN HISTORY - AUGUST 3rd

**1492** - Christopher Columbus set sail from Spain on his first voyage across the Atlantic. His fleet consisted of three ships-the Ninã, the Pinta and the Santa Maria.

**1900 -** The famous American newspaper reporter Ernie Pyle was born. He became well-known for his syndicated columns during World War II in which he described the life of American soldiers overseas. He visited almost every battlefront in Europe and Africa. He was killed by a Japanese machine-gunner during the battle for Okinawa.

#### **National News**

- ♦ U.S. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi arrived in Taiwan late Tuesday. She is the highest-ranking American official in 25 years to visit the self-ruled island claimed by China. China said that it would conduct military maneuvers in retaliation for her presence. Her visit has ratcheted up tension between China and the United States because China claims Taiwan as part of its territory.
- ♦ The death toll continues to climb due to a giant California wildfire as more bodies have been discovered. As of Tuesday, the so-called McKinney fire had charred more than 56,000 acres. Numerous homes have been destroyed and nearly 5,000 dwellings were listed as threatened by flames.
- ◆ The polio virus has been detected in wastewater samples from a suburban county near New York City. An unvaccinated adult recently contracted the life-threatening disease, but health officials said they have not identified any additional cases. This is the first case of polio in the United States in nearly a decade. The unidentified young adult had a strain of the virus that has since been genetically linked to samples found in Rockland County wastewater, and samples in London and the Jerusalem area. The CDC noted in a statement that the New York wastewater sample shows there may be more people in the community shedding the virus. The CDC also noted that they didn't have enough information at this time to determine if the virus is actively spreading in New York or elsewhere in the U.S., and no additional cases have been identified.
