#### Larry Wallace Passes Saturday

• Larry Wallace, the only person to ever head both the Tennessee Highway Patrol and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, passed away Saturday afternoon at his home near Athens after a short



battle with cancer. He was 77. The current TBI director, David Rausch, remembered Wallace as a man of integrity who led efforts to professionalize the state's criminal investigative agency during his 11 years in command. The current THP commander, Col. Matt Perry, also joined in the condolences. Wallace, a McMinn County native, began his career in 1964 as an officer with the Athens Police Department, getting hired three years later as a state trooper. See obituary on page 2. # **State & National News**

◆ The body of Bryce Evans, a missing Tennessee man, was found Friday, August 5<sup>th</sup> just after 11 a.m. in a remote section of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park near Balsam Mountain. Park Rangers located his vehicle at approximately 7:45 p.m. last Thursday. Evans' body was found by emergency responders about 20 yards off-trail, approximately 1.5 miles from the Balsam Mountain Trailhead parking area. No further details have been released at this time.

◆ Airlines canceled about 1,400 U.S. flights as thunderstorms hit the East Coast last Friday forcing flyers to cancel or reschedule their travel plans. Another 6,300 flights had been delayed by early Friday evening. This was the second straight day of major disruptions and the worst day for cancellations since mid-June. The most cancellations were recorded by the three major airports in the New York City area and Reagan National Airport outside Washington, D.C.

**FRIDAY'S MARKET REPORT:** Equities were mixed. The Dow posted a small gain. Interest rates moved notably higher. Ten-year Treasury yields topped 2.8%. Small-caps, energy and financials were among the leaders, indicating a slightly optimistic cyclical tone. The Nasdaq and technology sector lagged due to the jump in interest rates. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 76.65 to 32,803.47. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 6.75 to 4,145.19, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 63.03 to 12,657.55.
