# **National & World News**

• Americans got a slight break with the falling gas prices from the pain of high inflation last month, even though the surge in overall prices slowed only modestly from the four-decade high it reached in June. Consumer prices jumped 8.5% in July compared with a year earlier. Average paychecks are rising faster than they have in decades, but not fast enough to keep up with accelerating costs for food, rent, autos and medical services.

• Elon Musk has sold nearly \$7 billion worth of shares in Tesla as he gets his finances in order ahead of his court battle with Twitter. Musk disclosed in a series of regulatory filings that he unloaded about 8 million shares of his company Tesla Inc. in recent days.

◆ In London, children ages 1-9, were made eligible for booster doses of a polio vaccine Wednesday after British health authorities reported finding evidence the virus had spread in multiple areas of the city but found no cases of the paralytic disease in people. Britain's Health Security Agency said it detected in the sewage water of eight London boroughs, viruses derived from the oral polio vaccine. The agency's analysis of the virus samples suggested "transmission has gone beyond a close network of a few individuals." The agency has not located anyone infected with the virus and states that the risk to the wider population was low and the decision to offer young children boosters is a precaution.

◆ Former President Donald Trump invoked the Fifth Amendment on Wednesday and wouldn't answer questions under oath in the New York attorney general's long-running civil investigation into his business dealings. Trump stated that he "declined to answer the questions under the rights and privileges afforded to every citizen under the United States Constitution.'
