- ◆ Officers Suspended: Three Arkansas law enforcement officers have been suspended after a video circulated widely online over the weekend showing them punching and kicking a suspect while he was on the ground outside a convenience store. The Crawford County Sheriff's Office suspended two deputies while the city of Mulberry placed a local police officer on administrative leave pending an investigation, the agencies said in separate statements. The officers were not identified.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT:

Stocks finished lower. Rates were higher in response, with twoyear Treasury yields rising more than 10-year rates. The 10-year Treasury rate moved back above 3%. The consumer discretionary and financial services sectors also underperformed. Health care, consumer staples and utilities held up better. The S&P 500 fell 2% breaking a four-week winning streak. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 643.13 to 33,063.61. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 90.49 to 4,137.99, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 323.64 to 12,381.57.
