## **Food City Acquires More Stores**

◆ Food City officials have announced plans to acquire the Cooke's family of stores in the Greater Cleveland market area which include five Fresh n' Low locations, as well as the Cooke's Food Store & Pharmacy. Food City plans to retain the Cooke's/Fresh n' Low name and operate both formats in a similar fashion for the immediate future. Food City will also endeavor to hire the vast majority of the store associates. Steven C. Smith, Food City president and chief executive officer stated "We hope to finalize the acquisition and begin operation of the Cooke's family of stores by October 1st."

### **B** Rate Increase

Directors at Athens Utilities Board (AUB) are considering a local rate increase in the power division for the utility going into the final quarter of the year. The current increase being considered is only one percent (1%). The AUB board passed the first reading of a resolution on the rate increase Tuesday, August 23<sup>rd</sup> at the utility's August board meeting. A second reading of the rate resolution is set for the utility's September 27<sup>th</sup> board meeting. The local rate actions, if approved, will be effective October 1. This increase will increase power revenue for AUB by some \$569,967 annually. "We hope this is the last such increase for a while," stated Eric Newberry, General Manager. According to Newberry, a 'local' rate increase in power versus a TVA rate increase means additional revenue will stay at AUB for operating the division, and that's what this increase is for. This will add about \$3.00 to \$4.00 to the average residential bill. Part of this would be an additional 26-cents on the residential customer availability fee, going from \$16.06 to \$16.32 per month.
