Two Charged with Sexual Assault

McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy says two staff members of a local private school have been arrested and charged with Sexual Assault and Solicitation of a Minor. According to Sheriff Guy, detectives began an investigation after receiving a complaint that a series of incidents had occurred that involved staff members at Liberty Christian Academy on Hwy 11 south of Athens. As a result of the investigation,

Jason L Kennedy, 46, of County Road 172 Athens, was charged with 2 counts of Sexual Assault by an Authority Figure and 1 count of Solicitation of a Minor; Brittany Branham, 28, of County Road 172 Athens, was charged with 1 count of Solicitation of a Minor. Kennedy is the principal and a teacher at Liberty Christian Academy, Branham is a secretary and home school coordinator at the school. Both were booked into the McMinn County Jail early Friday morning, Kennedy under a \$60,000 bond and Branham under a \$15,000 bond. Both have since made bonds and were released. "It

appears, at this point, the case involves a single

juvenile female who was previously a student at Liberty Christian Academy. At this point, the incidents occurred in the Kennedy home where Ms. Branham also lives," said Sheriff Guy. "But we are continuing the investigation. It is always possible in cases like this that there may be other victims, and if so we hope they will contact us. We will always work to provide justice, closure, and support for victims of crime."
