Today in History

1862 - Union forces were defeated by the Confederates at the Second Battle of Bull Run in Manassas, Va.

1780 - American General Benedict Arnold betrayed his nation when he agreed to surrender the fort at West Point in New York to the British army. His plans were discovered and he fled to New York City where he joined the British army. He became known as America's most famous traitor.
