Wednesday's Market Report

Equity markets finished higher after Tuesday's sell-off. The dollar continues to strengthen. Bond yields are retreating. The 10-year Treasury yield fell. Commodity prices continue to slide as natural gas fell below \$8 and oil fell below \$83/barrel. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 435.98 to 31,581.28. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 71.68 to 3,979.87 and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 246.99 to 11,791.90.

TODAY IN HISTORY - SEP 8th

1754 - British seaman William Bligh was born. He became famous after a mutiny took place on his ship, "The Bounty." He and 18 members of his crew were forced off the ship and drifted 3,600 miles in the South Pacific before being rescued.

1776 - The Second Continental Congress officially changed the new American nation's name from "United Colonies" to "United States."

1836 - Abraham Lincoln received his license to practice law.

1896 - The first successful heart surgery was performed in Germany on a patient who had been stabbed in the heart during a fight.

1956 - On this Sunday night, 54,000,000 viewers (82.6 percent of the U.S. television audience) turned their TV dials to CBS to see and hear 21-year-old singer Elvis 'The Pelvis' Presley. Elvis sang *Don't Be Cruel* and *Ready Teddy*. Elvis got the largest fee to that date for appearing on The Ed Sullivan Show: \$50,000.
