According to a report issued in 2020 by the Federal Communica-

tions Commission, one in six rural Tennesseans lacks access to

broadband internet service. The Tennessee Department of Eco-

nomic and Community Development has awarded nearly \$120 mil-

lion in broadband grants over the past few years to expand broad-

band in rural areas of the state. Now, almost a half-billion dollars

will be awarded in new grants to provide broadband to more than

150,000 underserved homes and businesses across 58 Tennessee

Stocks finished higher after Wednesday's sizable sell-off. Technology names were the hardest hit by the news that inflation remains higher than the Feds 2% target. Ten-year Treasury yields moved higher to around 3.4%. Oil traded around \$88/barrel. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 30.12 to 31,135.09. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 13.32 to 3,946.01, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 86.10 to 11,719.68.

1789 - American novelist James Fennimore Cooper was born. He wrote "The Last of the Mohicans."

1821 - Costa Rica, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua and El Salvador became independent from Spain.

1857 - Our 27th President, William Howard Taft, was born. He did not enjoy being president and called the White House "the loneliest place in the world."

1885 - The world-famous elephant "Jumbo" died after being hit by a train. He had performed in P.T. Barnum's circus all over the world.

1916 - Tanks were used in war for the first time. The Allies used them on the Western Front during World War One.

1917 - Russia was proclaimed a republic by Alexander Kerensky, the head of a provisional government.

1963 - Four black girls were killed when a bomb exploded during Sunday services at a Baptist church in Birmingham, Ala., in one of the deadliest acts of the civil rights era.

1973 - Secretariat won the Marlboro Cup and set a world record for the 1-1/8 mile event. The legendary thoroughbred won in 1 minute, 45-2/3 seconds and earned \$250,000.

1982 - The first edition of the USA Today newspaper was published.

2000 - The Summer Olympics opened in Sydney, Australia.
