◆ TENNESSEE STATE PARKS RECEIVE AWARD:

Tennessee State Parks have been honored with the Project Excellence Award from the Society of Outdoor Recreation Professionals for the parks' innovative Tires to Trails program, which recycles tires. Tennessee State Parks officials, along with those from the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT), cut the ribbon in June on a new hard-surface pathway over 2.5 miles long – made from rubber crumbs derived from tires – at T.O. Fuller State Park in Memphis. The path is one of the longest rubber-bearing trails in the United States. The award was presented this month at the National Outdoor Recreation Conference in Knoxville and is presented annually to exemplary outdoor recreation projects and collaborating agencies and organizations who were key to the success.

TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: Markets traded lower. Growth and value performed similarly. The U.S. 10-year yield has passed 3.5%, in anticipation of higher Fed interest rates. Oil prices have stayed between \$80 and \$90 and traded around \$86. Natural gas fell to around \$7.7. European shares weakened. Asian stocks traded higher. The dollar was mixed. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 313.45 to 30,706.23. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 43.96 to 3,855.93, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 109.97 to 11,425.05.
