✓ The City of Athens Parks and Recreation Department has announced the completion of the *Walking for the Health of McMinn* and the beginning of an additional health initiative; *Move with the Mayor*. National and World News

♦ At the United Nations Wednesday, President Biden declared that Russia has "shamelessly violated the core tenets" of the U.N with its "brutal, needless war" in Ukraine. He said the war is an affront to the heart of what the international body stands for as he hoped to rally allies to stand firm in backing the Ukrainian resistance. Biden said reports of Russian abuses against civilians in Ukraine "should make your blood run cold." And the President said that Vladimir Putin's new nuclear threats against Europe showed "reckless disregard" for Russia's responsibilities as a signer of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons.

• On Wednesday, The Federal Reserve raised its target interest rate by three-quarters of a percentage point to a range of 3.00%-3.25% and signaled more large increases to come in new projections showing its policy rate rising to 4.40% by the end of this year before topping out at 4.60% in 2023 to battle continued strong inflation. Inflation is seen slowly returning to the Fed's target of 2% in 2025. Rate cuts are not foreseen until 2024.

♦ After about three months in captivity, two U.S. military veterans who disappeared while fighting Russia with Ukrainian forces have been released, according to relatives. On June 9, Alex Drueke, 39, and Andy Huynh, 27, went missing after their unit came under heavy fire in the Kharkiv region of northeastern Ukraine near the Russian border. "They are safely in the custody of the U.S. embassy in Saudi Arabia and will return to the states after medical checks and debriefing.
