1781 - American forces in the Revolutionary War, backed by a French fleet, began their successful siege of Yorktown, Va.


town, Va. **1787 -** The Congress of the Confederation voted to send the just-completed Constitution of the United States to state legislatures for their approval.

TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: After moving sharply higher in early trading, equities lost their momentum, with the Dow and S&P 500 closing slightly lower. There were no major headlines behind the move. Small-cap stocks finished higher on the day. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 125.82 to 29,134.99. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 7.75 to 3,647.29, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 26.58 to 10,829.50.
