## **Meigs County Man Pleads Guilty**

A Meigs County man who was charged with solicitation of a child has pleaded guilty in a Virginia court, according to Ninth Judicial District Attorney Russell Johnson. Johnson says that his office was contacted by the FBI Violent Crimes Against Children task force out of Virginia. The task force needed assistance locating, interviewing, and arresting Kevin Pemberton (in photo) of Meigs County for soliciting an undercover officer posing as a child. Investiga-



tors were able to locate Pemberton and interview him, in which Johnson said Pemberton confessed. A search warrant was also executed on his phone. Following this encounter, Pemberton attempted to flee. He was then arrested on warrants from Rockingham County, Virginia with the assistance of the Meigs Sheriff's Office. On Sept. 23rd, DA Johnson said that Pemberton had recently pleaded guilty to Proposal of a Sex Act by Communications System, which includes online solicitation of a minor. He received a five-year prison sentence that he is serving in a Virginia prison. Upon his release, he will be subject to supervision for life as a registered sex offender. (DA Johnson FB Photo)

## **Community News You Can Use**

✓ Directors at Athens Utilities Board voted Tuesday night to increase the power rate by 1% effective October 1<sup>st</sup>. AUB has raised power rates only four times, including this one, since 1997. The power increases that AUB has had are: a 3% increase in 2003; a 1.97% increase in 2007; a 1% increase in 2018; a 1% increase in 2021; and, this 1% increase in 2022. That is a total of 7.97% in about 25 years. Wayne Scarbrough said, "We know the score, believe me. No increase is ever wanted and no increase ever feels good, but I feel that our customers will understand that AUB has kept things as tight as possible. We never have an increase that is not needed." Annualized, AUB's increases over time equal two-tenths of a percent per year versus an annualized inflation rate of 2.3 percent per year over the last 15 years. Essentially, AUB has kept local costs in control such that they equal only one-tenth (1/10) of the rate of inflation for the same time frame. AUB General Manager, Eric Newberry said, "That's something to be proud of and something our customers can appreciate. That is one of the things that has us ranked at number four of 143 distributors in terms of low rates. We just don't raise rates unless we absolutely have to." he said.
