- ◆ The Meigs County Sheriff's Office investigated an incident that involved Meigs County High School last week. A minor was arrested and found to have a notebook containing "concerning entries" about Meigs County High. The concerning entries were not specified. The Sheriff's office said when the juvenile was arrested, it was not on school property and was not during school hours. The juvenile was found to possess the notebook then. A thorough search showed there was no evidence to back up the so called concerning entries related to the school. The Sheriff's Department conducted actions to ensure the safety of everyone at Meigs High. The suspect, who has not been identified, was placed in custody.
- ◆ A trial date has now been set for Melissa Blair, 39, of Englewood who was charged in early 2022 with having sexual contact with at least 18 teenage boys that resulted in more than 40 criminal counts. Blair now faces a trial date of August 8th, 2023 which was set last week by Circuit Court Judge Andrew Freiberg. Blair is free on a \$1 million bond. She is prohibited from being on school property and must remain in her vehicle when dropping off or picking up her children at school.

TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: Equities closed lower. The Dow Jones finished slightly higher. U.S. 10-year yields moved higher, trading around 3.9%. Renewed efforts by Chinese authorities to adhere to a zero-COVID-19 policy are sending the price of commodities lower, as investors fear further lockdowns and economic restrictions. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 36.31 to 29,239.19. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 23.55 to 3,588.84, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 115.91 to 10,426.19.
