1734 - Frontiersman Daniel Boone was born. He blazed the Wilderness Trail into Kentucky and gained fame as an Indian fighter.

1903 - The British newspaper *The London Daily Mirror* began publishing. **1954** - Strom Thurmond of South Carolina was the first U.S. senator elected by write-in vote.

1964 - The old McMinn County Courthouse was destroyed by fire which started while undergoing renovations. It was reduced to a near shell. Relay teams were organized to remove office equipment and valuable courthouse records.

1983 - President Ronald Reagan signed a bill establishing a U.S. federal holiday on the third Monday of January in honor of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.


Sarah Kite Receives Award
