



TODAY IN HISTORY - November 7th

1665 - The world's first newspaper was published. England's King Charles and his court were hiding in Oxford from the Great Plague. They were bored and were not getting much news of outside events. So, a man named Henry Muddiman wrote a journal for them and the newspaper was born.

1918 - Evangelist Billy Graham was born on a farm near Charlotte, North Carolina. He led crusades world-wide and began a radio program called "The Hour of Decision."

1944 - President Franklin Roosevelt was re-elected to an historic fourth term. No other president in history has served more than two terms.

FRIDAY'S MARKET REPORT Equity markets staged a relief Friday, yet they finished lower for the week. A strong rebound in Chinese stocks had some positive spillover effects, with authorities re-portedly trying to ease the impact of China's zero- COVID-19 policy. The Honk Kong equity index had its best day since 2015, while the Shanghai Composite gained nearly 2.5% on Friday and was up nearly 5.5% for the week, the most in two years. Oil also rallied today with WTI exceeding \$92, up about 5%. The 10-year Treasury yield rose modestly to 4.16% and was higher for the week on the back of the Fed's .75% increase on Wednesday and strong payroll gains. At the closing bell: DJIA 32,403.22 (+401.97); S&P 500 3,770.55 (+50.66); NASDAQ 10,475.25 (+132.31).
