Missing Person's Remains Found

◆ A missing girl's remains were found Sunday in a remote location in Monroe County, according to Sheriff Tommy Jones. 24-year-old Chelsie Walker, of Madisonville, was reported missing to the Madisonville Police Department on October 31. She was last seen at Madisonville Wal-mart. The Madisonville Police began investigating and later found evidence that she was last seen in Tellico Madisonville Detectives shared their evidence Plains with the Monroe County Sheriff's Office and both agencies launched a joint investigation into her disappearance. They found Walker's remains on Sunday in Monroe County. Two suspects are currently in custody and charges will be announced soon. The investigation is continuing.

◆ A Cleveland man died in a car accident on I-75 in Bradley County Monday afternoon, according to the Tennessee Highway Patrol. 79-year-old Hurley Upton was driving south near milemarker 34.5 when his pickup truck left the roadway and hit a tree just before 2 p.m. The truck was the only vehicle involved. The THP said he was not wearing a seatbelt.

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory will receive almost a half billion dollars for science and energy research. The lab announced recently that it would receive \$497 million. The bulk of the funding at Oak Ridge - \$256 million - will go to a fusion energy research project managed by the Department of Energy's Office of Science. A new Stable Isotope Production and Research Center will receive approximately \$75 million for medical, industrial, and national security research.

TODAY IN HISTORY - NOVEMBER 10th

1911 - The Carnegie Corporation of New York was established "to promote the advancement and diffusion of knowledge and understanding." It was the first of the great U.S. foundations for scholarly and charitable works.

1928 - It was on this day, after Knute Rockne delivered his 'Win One for the Gipper' halftime speech to the Irish players, that Notre Dame upset Army, 12-6. Rockne's speech: "The day before he died, George Gipp asked me to wait until the situation seemed hopeless, then ask a Notre Dame team to go out and beat Army for him. This is the day, and you are the team."
