THURSDAY'S MARKET REPORT:


Markets were up sharply after the October CPI (consumer price index) came in lower than expected. Both headline and core inflation came in better than expected, with headline inflation posting a 7.7% year-over-year price increase, while core inflation (excludes volatile food and energy) posted a 6.3% rise in prices. Used cars, apparel, and medical care services all saw price decreases. Shelter costs, food, and energy were all higher. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Average was up 1,201.43 to 33,715.37. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 207.80 to 3,956.37, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 760.97 to 11,114.15.
