Today In History

1804 - Our 14th President, Franklin Pierce, was born in New Hampshire. He became the first Democratic president since James K. Polk and campaigned on the slogan, "We Polked you in 1844...we shall Pierce you in 1852."

1859 - William Bonney was born in New York City. He was better known as "Billy the Kid," a notorious cattle rustler and killer in the Wild West.

1936 - Fluorescent lighting was used for the first time in a banquet hall in Washington, D.C., at a dinner celebrating the 100th anniversary of the U.S. Patent Office.

1945 - World War II rationing ended in the U.S. on all foods except sugar.

1954 - The Dow Jones Industrial Average finally surpassed it's pre-crash high - 25 years after Black Tuesday – when it closed at 382.74.

2000 - In a setback for Democratic presidential candidate Al Gore, the Florida Supreme Court refused to order Miami-Dade County to resume counting ballots by hand.

The S&P 500 and Nasdaq were all higher by over 1.0%. The 10-year U.S. Treasury yield continued to moderate, down 0.06% to 3.77% levels. The U.S. dollar continues to moderate as well, with the DXY dollar index down At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 397.82 to 34,098.10. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 53.64 to 4,003.58, and the NASDAO Composite Index was up 149.90 to 11,174.41. The third quarter earnings season is winding down, with over 96% of S&P 500 companies having reported earnings already. Overall, earnings growth for the quarter has come in at about 2.0%, well below the expected 9.0% growth forecast at the end of June. Overall, 70.5% of companies exceeded earnings forecast, slightly below the long-term average of 72%.
