The prize is a grant of \$5,000 sponsored by Lynn Jones Foundation. To compete, the business must be licensed and in business for at least 6 months but no longer than two years. The business must be located in any of the Cleveland State Community College five county service area, which includes Bradley, McMinn, Meigs, Monroe, and Polk. Applications are available at the Athens Chamber of Commerce or at mycs.cc/entrepreneur. All applications must be submitted by February 10th and sent to the Athens Chamber. The pitch competition will be held on the Cleveland State main campus in the George R. Johnson Heritage Center on March 30, 2023. If you qualify as a finalist, you will be given coaching for your pitch from the professional business counselors at the Small Business Development Center located on the Cleveland State Community College main campus.



TODAY IN HISTORY - JAN 5th

1779 - American naval hero Stephen Decatur was born. He is remembered for saying: "Our country...may she always be right; but our country, right or wrong."

1779 - Zebulon Pike, soldier and explorer, was born in New Jersey. He discovered what is now known as Pike's Peak in Colorado. 1781 - A British naval expedition led by Benedict Arnold burned Richmond, Virginia.

1855 - King Camp Gillette was born. He invented the safety razor.

1919 - The National Socialist (Nazi) Party was formed in Germany.

1925 - Democrat Nellie Tayloe Ross of Wyoming took office as America's first female governor, succeeding her late husband, William, following a special election.

1933 - The 30th president of the United States, Calvin Coolidge, died in Northampton, Massachusetts, at age 60. Construction began on the Golden Gate Bridge. (Work was completed four years later.)

Wednesday's Market Report

Major indexes were higher. Growth-style stocks outperformed. Treasuries rallied again. The 10-year Treasury yield was around 3.9%. The price of oil fell in trading around \$73. European and Asian shares were higher. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 133.40 to 33,269.77. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 28.83 to 3,852.97, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 71.78 to 10,458.76.
