U.S. equity markets rallied. The catalyst was the slower-than-expected wage growth reported in the payroll data. Long-term Treasury yields dropped to 3.55%. International markets were higher. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Average was up 700.53 to 33,630.61. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 86.98 to 3,895.08, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 264.05 to 10,569.29.

TODAY IN HISTORY - January 9th

1788 - Connecticut became the 5th state to ratify the U.S. Constitution

1793 - <u>Jean-Pierre Blanchard</u> made the first successful balloon flight in the United States. Blanchard's balloon, filled with hydrogen, took off from Philadelphia, PA, soared to 5,800 feet and eventually wound up some 15 miles away, in Woodbury, New Jersey.

1861 - Mississippi seceded from the Union.

1913 - Richard Nixon, the 37th President, was born. He was a Congressman and Senator from California, served as Vice-President under President Eisenhower, and was elected President in 1968 and re-elected in 1972. He resigned in 1974 while facing almost certain impeachment for his involvement in the Watergate scandal.

1968 - The Surveyor 7 space probe made a soft landing on the moon. It was the last of America's unmanned explorations of the lunar surface.

2001 - Apple Computer Inc. introduced its iTunes music management software.

2006 - "The Phantom of the Opera" became the longest-running Broadway show with 7,485 performances

2007 - Apple CEO Steve Jobs unveiled the iPhone.
