Decatur Woman Charged With Arson

◆ FROM THE TBI: An investigation by special agent fire investi-

gators with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Norris Police Department, and the 7th Judicial District Crime Task Force has resulted in the Dearrest of a catur woman arson and vandalism charges. February 11th, TBI



agents joined the Norris Police Department and the 7th Judicial District Crime Task Force in investigating a fire that occurred at a rehabilitation clinic located at 17 Ridgeway Road in Norris. Investigators determined the fire had been intentionally set. During the course of the investigation, information was developed identifying Tiffany Pearl Extine, 32, as the individual responsible for starting the fire. On Sunday, Tiffany Extine was arrested and charged with one count of Aggravated Arson and one count of Vandalism. She was booked into the Anderson County Jail.

On Feb. 15, 1961, 73 people, including an 18-member U.S. figure skating team en route to the World Championships in Czechoslovakia, were killed in the crash of a Sabena Airlines Boeing 707 in Belgium.

1898 - The U.S. battleship Maine mysteriously blew up in Havana Harbor, killing more than 260 crew members and bringing the United States closer to war with Spain.

1933 - President-elect Franklin D. Roosevelt escaped an assassination attempt in Miami that mortally wounded Chicago Mayor Anton J. Cermak; gunman Giuseppe Zangara was executed more than four weeks later.

TWU Hosts Kickoff Breakfast

Tennessee Wesleyan University hosted a Kickoff breakfast for its Community Campaign Tuesday, January 31st. The Community Campaign serves to involve donors who have supported Tennessee Wesleyan in the past but may not have in recent history. It will also serve to reach out to those who are not alumni but figures of the community who have been heavily responsible for Tennessee Wesleyan's growth. "I'm looking forward to seeing the response we have," said Jaquish. "I think our local people forget about us, or don't realize what an impact we have on the culture, and the economy of our community, and that's the story we need to tell." Lay, followed stating, "...tell the TWU story, because it's a great story." Tennessee Wesleyan's story is an integral part of the university,

and every donor, past, present, and future, is a vital piece of the story. "It's an easy sell, and I hope we knock that figure right out of the ballpark," Lay said.
