Thursday's gains. Technology and other growth parts of the market led the gains. Bonds rebounded some. The 10-year Treasury yield fell below 4%. Oil rose 4.5%. The Dow Jones Average was up 387.40 to 33,390.97. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 64.29 to 4,045.64, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 226.02 to 11,689.01.

Incident and Arrest Reports

♦ A Friendsville man is back in McMinn County Jail while awaiting trial on seven charges stemming from a 2021 overnight crime spree. According to warrants, On January 29, 2021, Officer Todd Levi of McMinn County Sheriff's office responded about 8:40 a.m. to the home of Christian Morgan, of County Rd 323, who reported that 25 year old Bradley Cole Steadmon of Friendsville and Jessica Womac knocked on his door about 3 am. Although Morgan said he told them he couldn't stay up because he had to go to work. While he was in the kitchen, he heard his gun cabinet open. When he turned around, he saw Steadmon pointing his own nine mm handgun at him and yelling. Morgan said that when Steadmon pulled the trigger the gun did not fire. But when he racked a bullet into the chamber, he fired into the floor. Morgan said that although the two had been close friends in the past, he now feared Steadmon would shoot or even kill him. He said Steadmon ordered Ms. Womac to gather Morgan's tools and put them into his vehicle. As Steadmon left, he said he would kill Morgan and his father if he didn't have \$10,000 by noon when he returned. Officers soon located Steadmon in Morgan's stolen car at Ms. Womac's home. They gave chase until the car crashed on County Rd 130. After a brief foot chase, authorities caught Steadmon and Womac. Deputies recovered the stolen car, tools and guns stolen from Morgan's home

Bradley Cole Steadmon was indicted by a McMinn County grand jury the following May. He now faces felony charges of especially aggravated kidnapping, theft of \$2,500 to \$10,000 of property, felony evading arrest, aggravated robbery, convicted felon in possession of a firearm, attempt to commit first degree murder, two counts of aggravated assault with a weapon. A criminal court trial is being scheduled for later this month.
