### **Incidents and Arrest Report**

♦ An area couple has been charged with five theft charges from December incidents. Kimberly A Lioviolette, 55, of Etowah received a shoplifting citation after police reportedly saw security video of her taking 10 items totaling \$38.82 without paying from the shelves of the Dollar General Store on South White Street, Athens, on December 19. Lioviolette was cited into court by APD officer Banfield. Since then, APD Det. Jamie Carmack said he learned through Walmart video surveillance that Lioviolette had entered the ladies' restroom there with an iPphone and exited without it after the owner Kinsey Hayes, a store employee, reported one missing. The video reportedly showed a woman later identified as Lioviolette and a man identified as William Luke entering adjacent ladies' and men's restrooms. They both exited together. William Frederick Luke Jr., 48, of Old Fort was also charged with five counts of theft.

♦ A 48-year-old Calhoun man faces FORTY-THREE FELONY charges after he allegedly threatened to kill TEN victims including family members and responding McMinn County deputies. This began when Deputies Caleb Latham and Kelly Liner answered a call on March 8 to 191 Co. Rd. where Shannon Wesley Wright was said to be threatening to kill all his family and any responding deputies. According to the complaint, Kayla Burger and Dylan Dorris told deputies they saw Wright go into his father, Clarence Wright's house, with a 9 mm handgun after being banned due to previously shooting at the house. Six adults and 3 children were in the house, and another man outside, she said. Witnesses said they saw Wright shoot the gun several times, but fled before deputies arrived. They added that several shots were fired. But before deputies could get everyone's statement, Wright drove by and took off in a green Jeep Cherokee so they gave chase. But he got away. While deputies searched for Wright, he called to tell dispatchers his side of the story, but he was uncooperative and refused to talk to Chief Blair. Later, Wright did call and said he was at 227, Co Rd 725. Deputies found him there and retrieved a handgun containing a single round. Cpl Harrison arrested Wright. After agreeing to talk without an attorney, Shannon Wright admitted firing the gun out the car window to scare Kayla. Charges include aggravated assault, aggravated burglary, possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony, and reckless endangerment for each victim. Bail was set at \$75,000.
