## **Incidents and Arrests**

◆ State authorities continue to investigate the deaths of two individuals whose bodies were found in a burning Etowah house, early Monday. The investigation is to confirm their identities and the causes of death.

**Saturday:** A Knoxville couple have been charged with 12 drug charges when McMinn County deputies stopped them for a faulty brake light, on Highway 11 at County Road 135.

McMinn County deputy Caleb Latham stopped a 2008 Dodge truck due to the faulty light issue. The driver, Thompson Barjeto, and a passenger, Kierra Yarbrough, both denied being on probation or parole, however Deputy Hawkins discovered both were on probation, Barjebo was in fact on probation for robbery. And aggravated burglary in Washington County but Barjebo said he was not aware of that. After obtaining consent to search, deputies discovered his license was suspended for failure to pay fines in Florida last July. With consent to search, deputies reported finding containers of what appeared to be fentanyl, heroin, ecstasy, cocaine, a green leafy substance, and several blue M30 pills thought to be fentanyl. Deputy Hawkins told deputies Latham and Benton he had seen Yarbrough toss baggies into a ditch and over a fence. Officers agreed the individual packaging appeared that they were bagged for resale. "M30s" imitate Oxycodone obtained from a pharmacy, but when sold on the street the pills routinely contain fentanyl. Thompson Bajebo and Kierra Yarbrough were each charged with six counts of possession of illegal drugs for resale, and tampering with evidence.

**Sunday:** An argument at a church resulted in a fight between two attendees. Brandon Strickland, a minister at Dream Life Ministries, County Road 266, reportedly told McMinn County Deputy Sarah Gray that Christopher "Alex" Rodgers assaulted another member, Trevor "T.J." Stewart when Rogers threw water on him in the restroom. Stewart reportedly said that he had told Rogers he wasn't supposed to have his phone on during church time. Stewart told Deputy Gray that Rogers told him to stop running his mouth and being a snitch. Stewart said that when he turned around, Rogers punched him in the face, apparently causing bruising and swelling. Stewart chose to file charges. Rodgers was arrested in the men's restroom on domestic violence assault, according to the report. Wes Hall, Reporter

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: The Federal Reserve raised interest rates by 0.25%, bringing the fed funds rate to 4.75% - 5.0%. On the banking crisis, the Fed remains ready to continue to use its liquidity tools to support the banking sector as needed. While it acknowledged that recent turmoil in the banking sector may lead to tighter credit conditions and a slowdown in economic activity, it continues to see the U.S. banking system as "sound and resilient." The market fell and Treasuries rallied. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 530.49 to 32,030.11. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 65.90 to 3,936.37 and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 190.15 to 11,669.96.
