6 Killed at Christian School

Covenant Christian School in Nashville was the location of the most recent mass school shooting in the United States. Yesterday, a 28-year-old former student opened fire with a rifle and killed three children and three adults before she was shot dead by police. The three students, 2 girls and 1 boy, were 9 years old. The three adults killed included the head of the school, 60 year old Katherine Koonce; a physical education teacher; Cynthia Peak, and a custodian; Mike Hill, both of whom were 61. The motive of the mass killing is unknown at this point. (Note: It's the policy of the Morning Fax to not mention the name of mass murderers)

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT

Stock markets closed higher as investors gained optimism that U.S. regulators would support struggling regional banks. First Citizens bank agreed to buy Silicon Valley Bank (SVB) after its bank failed largely due to a run on its deposits. This positive news around banks help to lead the S&P 500 financials sector higher. Technology and growth sectors lagged. The 10-year U.S. Treasury yield was up to around 3.5%. At the closing bell, the Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 194.55 to 32,432.08. The S&P 500 was up 6.54 to 3,977.53, and The Nasdaq Composite was down 55.12 to 11,768.84.
