### **Pollen Count / Market Report**

◆ The quantity of pollen grains in the air for today will increase and extend further into the extremely high range around 10.9. Since the weather has a major influence on pollen dispersal, this increase is due in part to rising temperatures, strong winds and lower relative humidity. The predominant pollen in Athens is Alder, Cedar/Juniper and Maple.

**TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT** Equities closed lower. A job openings report showed a marked slowdown in corporate hiring, an indication that the overall economic growth may be softening. Analysts expect a 6.6% year-over-year decline in the S&P 500 earnings per share. ISM manufacturing fell to its lowest level in months. Bond yields were lower. The 10-year Treasury yield closed just below 3.5%. European and Asian shares were mixed after the Australian central bank announced it would keep rates steady. Energy prices continue to move higher. Oil closed above \$80/barrel.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 198.77 to 33,402.38. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 23.91 to 4,100.60, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 63.13 to 12,126.33.
