TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT There was no major economic data today, but there were concerns about the U.S. debt ceiling. President Biden met with House Speaker Kevin McCarthy Tuesday but no consensus was reached. Banks continue to tighten lending standards. Yields were little changed. The dollar was slightly higher. At the closing bell, the Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 56.88 to 33,561.81. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 18.95 to 4,119.17, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 77.36 to 12,179.55.
