Two Killed in Tuesday Crash

A tragic wreck on the Landfill Road, County Road 750, has claimed the lives of two McMinn Co. High School students. A report from The Tennessee Highway Patrol stated that the wreck happened Tuesday afternoon around 4:25 p.m. near County Road 655 when a 2004 Chevrolet Cavalier being driven by a 17 year old was traveling north on County Road 750. Another vehicle, a red Toyota Tacoma, driven by 56 year old Kevin Hayes of Tennessee, was traveling south on County Road 750. The white Chevy Cavalier went off the right shoulder and then back on the roadway. The driver of the Chevy Cavalier over-corrected and continued sideways into the southbound lane. The red Toyota came to a complete stop in his lane. The Chevy Cavalier struck the Toyota with the driver's side door. The left rear passenger was ejected from the vehicle. The right front passenger was not ejected and was transported to the hospital. The right rear passenger was also ejected from the vehicle and was transported to the hospital. The THP report stated that the Chevy Cavalier had three 17 -year-old passengers including the driver. One additional passenger was identified as Robert Hicks, age 18.

Swim Classes at Ingleside Pool

City of Athens Parks and Recreation Department Swim Classes begin in May at the Ingleside pool. The large class size for Level 1 – Introduction to water skills (Beginner), Level 2 – Fundamental Aquatic Skills (Beginner), and Level 3, Stroke Development (Advanced) classes are from May 30 thru June 9. Session 1 for the small class size for Level 1, 2, and 3 is from June 13 thru June 29 and Session 2 class is from July 11 thru July 27. Below are some reminders for the class:

• Large Group lessons include 8, 45-minute lessons. Small Group sessions include 6, 45-minute lessons.

• Please ensure students are in the pool area, ready to swim promptly at lesson time. Students must also be picked up promptly at lesson's end.

• All students should come prepared to swim in appropriate swimming attire, as well as sunscreen. Students should also have a towel. Puddle jumpers, water well as suincited. Students should also have a lower, it dute jumpers, water wings, etc... are not needed. If you choose to send goggles, please make sure they are competitive swim-type and not a mask that covers the nose. Part of learning to swim is being able to blow bubbles out the nose. Wearing a mask will hinder the student from learning this very important skill. Also, if you choose to send goggles, please make sure they fit properly. The less distractions, the better

• Parents/Guardians are not required to wait by the pool during the lesson. However, please remain in the pool area. You can bring a chair to sit in the shade away from the pool, so students are able to fully concentrate on their swimming instruction. We will have time at the end of each class for showing off newly learned skills

• A certified lifeguard is on duty during all lessons. All students and accompanying parents/guardians are expected to follow all pool rules and facility policies at all times. Register HERE
