World and National News

- ◆China and the United States agreed Monday to try and stabilize their intense rivalry to avoid veering into conflict. No announcement was made of any major breakthroughs during a rare visit to Beijing by U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken, but they hope to work together to stabilize and improve relations.
- ◆Tornadoes swept through Mississippi Monday night, killing one and injuring nearly two dozen, according to officials on Monday. There was damage from storms in which high temperatures and hail in some areas accompanied tornadoes.
- ◆Oil prices fell on Monday. West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude was down 49 cents. Trading volumes were thin due to the Juneteenth U.S. holiday.

Today In History

1863 - West Virginia became the 35th state. It was originally part of Virginia, which had seceded from the Union during the Civil War. The western counties in Virginia supported the North and declared their independence from Virginia. Eventually, they became West Virginia.

1867 - The U.S. purchased the territory of Alaska from Russia for \$7 million, or about 2¢ per acre.

1924 - Certified Guitar Picker Chet Atkins was born.

1939 - W2XBS (later WCBS-TV) in New York City televised the first TV operetta. *Pirates of Penzance*, composed by Gilbert and Sullivan, was presented to a very small viewing audience. Television was a new, experimental medium at the time.

1945 - Singer Anne Murray was born in Canada. Her first big hit was "Snowbird." $\,\,$

1949 - Singer Lionel Richie was born. He was the lead singer of the Commodores before going solo. Among his hit records, "Say You, Say Me."

1977 - Oil began flowing through the 789-mile-long Alaska pipeline.

2001 - Andrea Yates drowned her five children, who ranged in age from 6 months to 7 years, in the bathtub in her family's home in Houston.
