New Legislation by Senator Lowe

As Tennessee ushers in the new fiscal year on July 1, a slew of new laws passed by the General Assembly will go into effect. State Senator Adam Lowe, who represents McMinn County, was instrumental in passing many of these new laws to bolster security at schools, enhance public safety and support children and teachers. Lowe championed comprehensive measures to enhance school safety this year, including legislation that strengthens safety standards at public and private schools. The new law includes requirements such as classroom door locks, security vestibules for visitor entry and bulletresistant film on exterior entry-level windows. The law also requires schools to develop annual safety plans that must include a newly required incident command drill for school leaders and law enforcement to prepare for various emergencies. "Nothing is more important than the safety of our schools," said Lowe. "These measures will go a long way toward bolstering security at our schools and help prevent future tragedies like the shooting at Covenant School in Nashville.'

✓ Shaw Group Industries, Inc., one of the world's largest carpet manufacturers, has announced plans to close their plant in Meigs County. The Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development said they were notified of the permanent closure of Plant 10 in Decatur after the Dalton-based company filed an official Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification on Tuesday, June 27th. The closure of the Decatur plant affects 336 jobs, and the facility is expected to officially close its doors on August 29, 2023. The Decatur plant's production efforts will shift to other facilities in Northwest Georgia, and those employed at Plant 10 will be able to apply to other surrounding plants. 1861 - William Mayo, founder of the world-famous Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, was born.
