### **Stabbing on Jones Street**

Around 3 a.m. Monday morning, officers with the City of Athens Police Department responded to 1211 Jones Street in reference to a stabbing incident. Upon arrival they made contact with a male subject who was lying in the backyard with multiple stab wounds. Detectives with the Athens Police Department responded to the scene for processing and evidence collection. Statements taken from multiple witnesses on scene yielded the incident stemmed from an alcohol fueled domestic argument. The homeowner advised the male suspect showed up at the residence looking for his wife and forced his way into the residence assaulting him and destroying items within the residence. The homeowner further stated that his daughter came to the residence to seek shelter from her drunk husband, who had called her several times making threats before he showed up at the residence. The homeowner advised he grabbed the first thing he could find to stop the attack; a knife was used during the altercation. EMS transported the wounded patient to an undisclosed trauma center for medical treatment. The suspect was undergoing emergency surgery at the time of the press release. "The case is still under investigation and is currently being discussed with the 10<sup>th</sup> District Attorney General's Office," according to Lieutenant Witt of the Athens Police Department.

All non-profit organizations in the Athens Federal Foundation service area that fit the organization's mission are encouraged to apply, including those in Bradley, McMinn, Meigs, Monroe and Polk counties. The Foundation anticipates receiving more requests for support than it can approve but encourages all applicants to apply and keep the Foundation informed of their activities and needs.
