


Stolen Property Recovered

Officers with the City of Athens Police Department spoke with a representa-tive from Heil Corporation in Athens in reference to a large number of tools taken from the facility valued over \$5,000 dollars. In the photo is approximately \$6,500 dollars of stolen tools that were recovered by the Athens Police Depart-ment Criminal Investigation Division. Employees of Heil reported the tools stolen on July 28th with the suspect being a former employee. The investigation is still ongoing, and charges are pending from Detective Roberts.
