eigs County will soon receive a tremendous honor. There has been discussion for well over a decade about what to do when The Chattanooga National Cemetery runs out of room for future burials. Chattanooga National Cemetery was created almost 160 years ago for soldiers killed in the Civil War battles on Lookout Mountain, Missionary Ridge, and Chickamauga GA. Since then the historic ground has become the final resting place of Medal of Honor recipients and veterans who fought before and after the cemetery was created, but at some point in the not too distant future the cemetery will run out of space for more burials and the answer to what happens then is going to be in Meigs County. The Department of Veterans Affairs has just purchased 270 Acres of property in the Blythe Ferry area of Meigs County and will build a new national cemetery there. The VA looked at property in other states, but for local veterans families it is important to have the new national cemetery close-by and Meigs County is the place it will be. Retired Army Major General Matt Quinn is Under Secretary for Memorial Affairs. He leads national cemeteries for the Department of Veterans Affairs and made the official announcement vesterday. Congressman Chuck Fleischmann was involved in the process as well. More info at: NC9.com

McMinn County woman charged with sex crimes against minors appeared in court Monday, October 2nd. Melissa Blair is accused of having sexual relations with 18 male students at McMinn Central High School. She faces 44 charges. A change of venue was requested but denied by Judge Andrew Freiberg, Defense attorney Robert Kurtz, who is representing Blair, said the attention of Blair's case could make it more difficult to select from a pool of jurors. Judge Freiberg admitted pre-trial publicity could become a problem and set Blair's next hearing for Nov. 6th at 1:30pm.

TWU Enrollment Up!



Tennessee Wesleyan University's Fall 2023 enrollment saw gains over the previous Fall semester. According to university data after census day, the 14th day of classes and recognized as the official enrollment day of each semester, the largest gain was in graduate enrollment. "The increase in enrollment was largely due to the almost 70% increase in graduate program enrollment," said Dr. Tyler Forrest, Tennessee Wesleyan University President. "Diversifying our course offerings has been a priority for many years, and the increase of graduate programs is a key driver in future enrollment. Tennessee Wesleyan recently received approval to launch two more graduate programs, a Master of Science in Sport Leadership and Master of Science in Project Management. These two programs will complement the five programs already in the University's portfolio, including a Master of Arts in Teaching, Master of Science in Education, Master of Business Administration, Master of Occupational Therapy, and Master of Science in Nursing. The Master

of Science in Sport Leadership will have two distinct tracks, one for coaching and one for athletic administration. The Master of Science in Project Management will be housed within the Goodfriend School of Business and support students wishing to advance their knowledge in project management or enter the profession mid-career. Other programs seeing increases included the Bachelor of Dental Hygiene and online RN-BSN program within the TWU-Fort Sanders Nursing Department. Dual Enrollment classes were up 14% year-over-year. "Many high school students want to get ahead in their college degree, and the dual enrollment option provides college credit coursework that also meets high school requirements," said Sara Hopper, Executive Director of Admissions at TWU. "We have provided dual enrollment options for many years but want to make sure students know we are a viable option in that space and accept the Dual Enrollment Grant (DEG) through the state of Tennessee that will cover the cost of the first five dual enrollment courses." Tennessee Wesleyan University, founded in Athens, Tennessee, in 1857, is a four-year liberal arts institution affiliated with the Holston Conference of the United Methodist Church offering more than 30 undergraduate and graduate programs.
