New Training Techniques: Officers with the City of Athens Police Department have recently implemented a new training technique to their annual requirements-Virtual Reality Training. Training is constantly evolving, and this platform assists the Athens Police Officers to further their training to keep Athens safe. The State of Tennessee POST Commission requires POST Certified Officers to complete an annual in-service training and this requirement is 40 hours of instruction and testing. The classes ranged from Mental Health Awareness, Taser Re-Certification, Emergency Vehicle Operations, to Firearms Re-Certifications. The Athens Police Department adds more class hours to its yearly in-service training beyond state requirements. In addition to the state requirements, added is a Crime Scene Management refresher where the course focuses on new techniques in collecting DNA and fingerprints along with hands on portions where the Officers locate and collect "trace evidence." Also added is a Legal Refresher where the topics range from 4th Amendment Search & Seizure Rights to Probable Cause Stops & Search Warrants, and Court Testimony instruction. "We were very fortunate to have Assistant District Attorney Dorothy Cherry from the 10th Office to lead the Legal Refresher course. With the laws ever changing, we are so appreciative of her time and knowledge to educate the department on new legal updates. (Story continued at right)
