Youth Basketball League Registration

✓ The City of Athens Parks and Recreation Department announces registration will be open November 1st through November 26th for the 2023-24 Youth Basketball League. The league is for boys and girls from pre-K through 6th grade. The focus of this recreational league is to teach the fundamentals of basketball, introduce new players to the game, and to improve the health of the players through physical exercise. This is done with a maximum two-hour per week commitment, with one hour set aside for practice and one hour for games and with all players playing a minimum of two complete quarters of each game. The cost is \$75 per player, which includes a reversible NBA jersey and matching shorts, a basketball, secondary medical insurance for each player, background checks for coaches, and game official expenses. There will be a skills assessment on Monday, November 27th at 6 pm, for 3rd through 6th graders at the former Westside Elementary School. Pre-k through 2nd grade do not have a skills assessment. Practices will begin in December and will be held at the former North City and Westside elementary schools during the work. Games are surrently schools for the following Satur during the week. Games are currently scheduled for the following Satur-days: January 6, 13, 20, 27, and February 3, 10, 17, 24, with the possibility of some Friday evening games, at Athens City Middle School. Appli-cations are also being accepted for volunteer coaches and assistants. Anyone wishing to coach, or asist, will be required to pass a back-ground check, and complete a training course. Applications are available in the Parks and Recreation office and on the City of Athens website, www.athenstn.gov. "Our main focus of the City of Athens Youth Basketball program is introducing children to the sport and teaching funda-mentals. We're so excited to offer the youth of our community this out-let, and instill in them a love of recreation," stated Derek Phillips, Program Coordinator. Players can register online at www.athenstn.gov, by phone or in person at the Athens Parks and Recreation Office, located inside Athens City Hall at 815 N. Jackson Street. TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT

After spending much of the day bouncing around the flat line, equities finished higher. Small-caps and cyclicals, including financials, industrials and consumer staples, were the best performers on the day. Ten-year government bond yields were up slightly.

At the closing bell, the Dow Jones Industrial Average was +123.91 to 33,052.87. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was +26.98 to 4,193.80, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was + 61.76 to 12,851.24.

TODAY IN HISTORY - November 1st

1871 - War correspondent and author Stephen Crane was born in New Jersey. He wrote a masterpiece about the Civil War titled "The Red Badge of Courage."

1937 - Singer Bill Anderson was born in Georgia. He has written and recorded many hit records, including "Still," "Mama Sang A Song," and "I Get The Fever." He is still a regular performer on the Grand Ole Opry.

Opry. 1939 - Rudoph the Red-nosed Reindeer was born. The story of Rudolph first appeared in a pamphlet given away by a Chicago store. The song, written by Johnny Marks, is based on the story. It was recorded by Gene Autry and became a tremendous Christmas-time hit.

1950 - Two Puerto Rican nationalists tried to assassinate President Harry Truman. They failed, but the attempt caused two deaths and several injuries.
