



THANKSGIVING HISTORY AND FACTS:

The first Thanksgiving was celebrated in 1621 over a three-day harvest festival, but it wasn't observed as a national holiday until 1863. It included 50 Pilgrims, 90 Wampanoag Indians, and lasted three days. It is believed by historians that only five women were present. Historians believe the first Thanksgiving meal consisted largely of seafood, like mussels, lobster, and clams. Diners almost certainly ate venison and likely some assortment of wild fowl-turkey, duck, goose and swan. Pumpkin Pie wasn't on the menu at the first Thanksgiving. The TV dinner was invented by a Swanson employee in 1953 thanks to Thanksgiving. "Jingle Bells" was originally a Thanksgiving song. It was originally published under the title "The One Horse Open Sleigh" and was written by James Lord Pierpont to commemorate Medford, Massachusetts annual sleigh races around Thanksgiving.

Fire on Co Rd 906-Mobile Home Fire-Vehicle Fire

Close to 1 am Tuesday morning, 911 Dispatch received a call of a massive fire on Co Rd 906, Etowah that could be seen from Tennessee Avenue and was spreading fast. They were also notified there was a structure on fire with entrapment. The occupants were able to barely escape the single wide mobile home with one having minor injuries. The structure and 2 vehicles were a total loss. Approximately 5 acres of woodland burned. Agencies responding were Etowah Rural Fire, Etowah City Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, Athens Rural Fire, Athens City Fire Polk Fire and Tennessee Department of Forestry. Assisting Agencies were McMinn County EMA Director Tom Trotter, Athens City Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth, McMinn County Sheriff's Department, AMR and EUB. Agencies standing by for Etowah Fire District was Bradley County Fire Department and for Englewood Fire District was Madisonville City Fire Department. The Command Post location was Calvary Baptist Church on County Road 890, Etowah. The Fire Grounds Operations Officer in command was Etowah Rural Fire Chief Adam Hafley and Incident Command Operations Officer in command was Englewood Rural Fire Chief Billy Roach.
