Improvement Grant for Etowah

ssistant Majority Leader Mark Cochran, R-Englewood, and State Sen. Adam Lowe, R-Calhoun announced recently a \$300,000 Downtown Improvement Grant for Etowah from the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development. The grant is part of more than \$4 million in overall funding that was recently awarded to support improvements to building façades and outdoor public spaces in 17 Tennessee Downtowns and Main Street communities. "Downtown Etowah is full of history and natural beauty," Cochran said. "This Improvement Grant will help make the area even more appealing for residents and visitors alike. I appreciate the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development's partnership in granting these funds." Lowe said, "This is great news for Etowah. This grant will not only enhance the physical land-scape of the city but also breathe new life into the local economy. I look forward to seeing the improvements take shape." To be eligible for a Downtown Improvement Grant, applicants had to be a designated Tennessee Downtowns or Tennessee Main Street Community. Grants were awarded to qualifying organizations that illustrated the need for improvements and the ability to execute an effective design plan for building façades, way-finding signage, gateways, and streetscapes. Each new recipient is also required to match 25 percent of the funding received.
