3 Charged in Cattle, Tractor Thefts

Several suspects have been charged in recent thefts of cattle and tractors in McMinn Co, as well as other livestock thefts in surrounding counties. According to McMinn Co Sheriff Joe Guy, on October 10, Deputies with the McMinn County Sheriff's Office investigated a report of a stolen Kubota tractor from County Road 446 near Englewood, During the process of the investigation, it was found Mr. Gary Hill was the suspect in the theft and detectives discovered the tractor had been taken to Bristol, and then to Hiwassee, Georgia a few days later. Detective Amber Cook located the individual in Georgia and the Kubota tractor was recovered and returned to the owner. Gary Hill, of Monroe County, was a suspect in this case. On Dec 3, McMinn Co Deputies responded to a report of 5 stolen cattle from County Road 419 near Englewood. Pictures of the

tives, along with State Ag Crimes investigator Clint Brookshire, found Mr Dewayne Pressley and Ms. Donna Vaughn were directly involved in the theft along with Mr. Gary Hill, according to Sheriff Guy. The cattle were located in Lincoln County and were returned to the owner. Over the course of the next few days, McMinn County Sheriff's Deputies, Sweetwater Police, and Detectives and Agent Brookshire worked extensively on the case. Dewayne Pressley and Donna Vaughn were located in the Rural King Parking lot in Sweetwater on Dec 6 and were taken into custody. On Dec 7, Corporal Caleb Latham had contact with Gary Hill and was able to negotiate a peaceful surrender. Mr. Gary Hill was safely taken into custody and transported to the McMinn Courty Sheriff's Department where he is being held on the following charges: 1)Theft over \$5,000 for theft of the cattle 2) Illegal Possession or Fraudulent use of credit/debit card x 2 -Athens City Police Department 3) Theft of Property for theft of horses-Monroe Courty Sheriff's Department 4) theft of Property for theft of horsees- Loudon County Sheriff's Department 4) Violation of Parole- Blount County Sheriff's Department
